"Bring Home the Kitchen" Capital Campaign Success! A Message from the Chair of our Board of Directors

Dear members,

On Friday, November 17th, we officially reached our "Bring Home the Kitchen" capital campaign goal and raised \$387,000 for phase 2 renovations! While the "Bring Home the Kitchen" capital campaign officially launched in October, it was a project that had been in development for quite some time. When our organization first moved to our new location, we could not afford all the renovations at once. For the last two years, we have been a community kitchen without a commercial kitchen of our own!

Thanks to our hard-working grant writers and campaign team, when "Bring Home the Kitchen" officially launched in October, we had already raised 64 % of the total campaign goal. The campaign to fund our much-needed commercial kitchen and accessibility updates, received tremendous support from various donors, including community members, local businesses, and philanthropic organizations. A long-time generous anonymous donor pledged to match the first \$50,000 of donations received in October. Notable donations came from The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Tri-Eagle Development and Cadillac Homes (pictured above), past board member Jacquie Farris, volunteer Carl Stovel, the Times Colonist Christmas Fund and the Sovereign Order of Saint John of Jerusalem, Knights Hospitaller, the District of Saanich, as well as local businesses Waterworks Irrigation and Abstract Developments. In addition, our Jazz Bar benefit concert event raised over \$26,000 in a single afternoon, making the total raised in October \$52,278, which was turned into \$102,278!

Our team is truly overwhelmed with gratitude and so encouraged by the community's generous support for the project. Together, we are building our long-awaited commercial kitchen, conducting accessibility upgrades, and improving workshop and office spaces at the Shelbourne Community Kitchen's new home!

While our foremost focus is on establishing a commercial kitchen, the positive impact of this project will go far beyond. This is an opportunity for us to expand and enrich our programs, to create leadership and workplace training opportunities for people accessing services, and to create new income streams that will allow us to invest in our organization's long-term sustainability. We will have the ability to commercially produce in-house meal items for our pantry program and for revenue. Our jams, jellies and zucchini relish have been missed! Commercial kitchen rental space is a need in our community that we will also be able to address.

Our team is so excited to build even more synergy among programs, and to have a functional commercial kitchen that will allow us to do so much more for the community we serve.

In the coming weeks, we will send detailed information about phase 2 renovations, including the programs and services that will be available during construction.

Renovations are currently scheduled to begin in January, 2024.



A Message from the Health & Safety Committee

The Shelbourne Community Kitchen's Health and Safety Committee works to promote the safety and wellbeing of all members, staff and visitors to program facilities. This fall, we are at quite a different place in relation to COVID-19 than we have been in previous years. We are in a better place, but we are not in a completely safe place. Cold and flu season has arrived, along with rising cases of COVID-19. The Shelbourne Community Kitchen's high standard of cleanliness and regular surface sanitizing continues, and additional face masks and hand sanitizer are available on site.

Gentle Reminders from Health & Safety:

- Regular hand washing is one of the best ways to remove germs, avoid getting sick, and prevent the spread of germs to others.
- If you feel unwell: please stay home, test, and monitor your symptoms.
- The National Advisory Committee on Immunization recommends that everyone six months of age and older get the XBB. 1.5 vaccine if it has been six months or longer since their last COVID-19 vaccination or COVID-19 infection. <u>Learn more</u>.

The Health and Safety Committee continues to monitor updates from the BCCDC and Chief Medical Officer, and will send updates throughout winter, as needed.

Matzah Ball Soup Meal Kit Distribution December 12th & 13th

Is there anything more comforting than a bowl of hot chicken soup on a cold winter's day? Matzah (or matzo) Ball Soup is a traditional Ashkenazi Jewish chicken soup that can be found on kitchen tables and Jewish delis across the globe. Matzah Balls are made from a dry unleavened bread called Matzah that when mixed with eggs, water, and chicken fat make beautifully light and flavorful dumplings that pair perfectly with the clear broth, shreds of chicken, and pieces of vegetables that help make this dish so comforting! This meal kit is being distributed during the end of Hanukkah so if you are interested in trying a Jewish holiday classic this is the kit for you.

There is no class component with this meal kit distribution. Registrants will receive a meal kit with all the required ingredients and printed recipes to make at home.

Important Considerations:

- Limit of one meal kit per household.
- There will be no live video component for this meal kit. Registrants will receive a meal kit with all the required ingredients and printed recipes to make at home.
- This meal kit can be made vegetarian and/or halal to meet dietary restrictions.
 Unfortunately, this recipe can not be adapted to meet gluten free dietary restrictions.
- A limited number of meal kits will be reserved for delivery and dedicated solely for members who live with chronic illness/mobility barriers, who cannot safely attend inperson.

The deadline to register is **December 1st**, however programs fill up quickly!

Chicken Adobo is an authentic Filipino dish and is one of the most recognized Filipino foods around the world. Adobo is prepared by stewing meat, fish, or vegetables in vinegar and soy sauce along with aromatic herbs and spices such as garlic, black peppercorns, and bay leaves. 25 meal kits were shared, providing delicious dinner for a total of 48 adults and children.
